Allowing students the choice between broad or specialised themes of study, the International and European Law programme prepares students for professional careers in international organisations, private law firms, public and private institutions and academia. Students are able to tailor their own experience with courses from several tracks offered, including Public International and Human Rights Law, European Union Law and Policy, Transborder Commercial Law, and Law and Finance.

The International and European Law programme is available as a one year academic programme.

Students have to complete the two Foundation courses, four Mandatory courses, a minimum of 4 substantive courses, and defend their master thesis.

The masters programme in Law and Finance equips both law and finance specialists with knowledge regarding the close and often intertwined relationship between the two disciplines. It facilitates understanding of the wide array of multidisciplinary issues at hand and delivers in-depth knowledge of the interrelation of the legal and economic aspects of firms and markets operating in the European Union and beyond.

The masters programme in Law and Finance can be undertaken as a one or two year academic programme depending on prior qualifications.

The one year masters programme consists of 60 ECTS of theoretical study with an interaction between law and finance disciplines emphasised within each course track with 30 ECTS devoted to a thesis.

The two year academic masters programme consists of 120 ECTS of theoretical study of which 30 ECTS are devoted to a thesis.

In the one year programme, students have to complete six mandatory courses and two optional course chosen from other masters streams, and defend their masters thesis.

For the two year programme, students have to complete 22 substantive courses from various streams, in addition to the mandatory courses, and defend their

masters thesis at the end of the programme if students have chosen to follow a two year programme. These courses cover areas such as commercial law, private law, international law, economics and finance as well as policy and regulation.

In addition to the selected mandatory courses, all students have to complete a law foundation courses as well as a course in legal research.

Designed at the intersection of public international law and human rights law, this masters programme offers an in-depth look at the fundamental legal issues of the two specialisations as well as their interaction. Leveraging the extensive human rights law expertise of RGSL faculty, the master's programme prepares students to work with international law and human rights spheres both at national and international levels.

The programme explores legal issues surrounding sovereignty, fundamental rights, state responsibility, criminality. In addition the programme focuses on international institutions, courts and arbitral bodies involved in the creation of global rules in the area of human rights.

The one year masters programme consists of 60 ECTS of theoretical study within each course track of which 30 ECTS are devoted to a thesis. Following successful completion, students are awarded a Masters degree (LL.M.) in Public International Law and Human Rights.

Students have to complete six mandatory courses and two optional courses chosen from other masters prorgamme streams and defend their master thesis at the end of the programme.

In addition to the selected mandatory courses, all students, regardless of the programme, have to complete a law foundation course as well as a course in legal research.

The programme's rich instruction in the intricacies of the European Union and its laws and policies helps to train the next generation of experts in international law and diplomacy.

The programme explores political and legal themes relating to the single market, decision making, justice, security and defense as well as energy and environment.

The one year masters programme consists of 60 ECTS of theoretical study including 30 ECTS devoted to a thesis. Following successful completion, students are awarded a Masters degree (LL.M.) in European Union Law and Policy.

Executive-style schedules allow ambitious students and professionals to combine work and studies.

The programme is also offered on a parttime basis with the duration of the part time programme dependent on a schedule tailored to the student. Normally, the duration of study is doubled. For example, the one year programme takes two years to complete if followed on a part time basis.

The one year masters programme consists of 60 ECTS of theoretical study including 30 ECTS devoted to a thesis. Following successful completion, students are awarded a Masters degree (LL.M.) in Transborder Commercial Law.

Executive-style schedules allow ambitious students and professionals to combine work and studies.

The programme is also offered on a parttime basis with the duration of the part time programme dependent on a schedule tailored to the student. Normally, the duration of study is doubled. For example, the one year programme takes two years to complete if followed on a part time basis.

Providing students with the tools necessary to navigate the complex regulatory systems developing around new technologies (e.g. data protection, ICT contracts, intellectual property rights, cyber security), the masters programme in Technology Law provides an innovative and competitive degree in a rapidly growing area of specialisation.

Research at RGSL is supported by the RGSL Law Library which is a popular place for students, faculty and visitors alike. Located on the top floor of the university, with stunning views across Art Nouveau Riga, it offers the top collection of legal literature in the Baltics and Northern Europe.

The library is open to students from RGSL and other universities, teaching staff, and the public. In addition to students, an increasing number of professionals make extensive use of the library, with its impressive collection of law books, legal journals, and access to valuable legal and multidisciplinary databases such as Westlaw International, HeinOnline, and resources from the Kluwer Law and Oxford University Press, and others.

Workspaces in the library are available for all students, with modern study environment and a rooftop terrace, which is especially good for taking study breaks or simply for some fresh air.
