

The programme covers major fields of public international law. Furthermore, it focuses on international organizations and EU institutions, and their role in shaping international relations. On the diplomacy side, the programme delves into history and political sciences.

Language courses focus on English as a world language, with a view to terminology in law, international relations, and business. Students may also take courses in the traditional diplomatic language of French.

Dr. Fillers has a PhD in Law from University of Antwerp. Due to his research on the United Nations Convention on Contracts for the International Sale of Goods he is one of the sought after experts among this year's Vis Moot competition student teams, and a regular speaker at conferences. Dr.Fillers coaches RGSL Vis Moot team this year. He teaches Introduction to Civil Law, Contract Law, Private International Law, Law on Obligations and Property Law.



Alumni

The geography of RGSL alumni reaches 51 countries of the world. Most of them are from Latvia, but we also have graduates from Finland, France, Georgia, Germany, Netherlands, the United States, etc.

More than half of our graduates are working in different areas of the private sector. Among the employers are the largest Baltic law firms such as Sorainen, Ellex Klavins, Deloitte, Klotini Sergis, as well as banks and international companies, such as Swedbank, PWC, Ernst & Young and others.

The public sector – ministries, parliaments, government agencies and courts – is the second biggest employer of RGSL graduates. This includes both Latvian and European institutions such as the European Commission, the European Court of Justice and the European Parliament.

Quite often, our former students continue their relationship with RGSL as employees or lecturers.

After graduation I started working in the public sector – I'm head of

Procurement and contracts department of the State defence logistics and procurement center, as I wanted to get some work experience before entering post-graduate studies. I'm also involved in startup marketing as a volunteer and attending the SSE Riga Future Leaders academy. RGSL was a source of legal and business knowledge, and also gave a chance to interact with leading lawyers, diplomats, judges and business experts. Public lectures, seminars, conferences, Erasmus exchange were opportunities worth taking. My knowledge and experience now help me to solve legal issues, analyze problems and create solutions, have assurance of my work and a rapid career growth.

Admission requirements

The average grade in diploma supplement corresponding to European Credit Transfer System (ECTS) level of C or higher (7 grade points according to Latvian 10-point grading scale);

Proficiency in English confirming at least level B2 or higher in accordance with the Common European Framework of Reference (CEFR):

- ▶ IELTS Academic Test (not older than 2 years) - the required score is at least 6.0;
- ▶ TOEFL (not older than 2 years) - the required score is at least 550 points (for a computer test - 213; Internet based test - 80);
- ▶ State Centralized English Examination (applicants from Latvia) – minimum attainable requirement - 70%;
- ▶ Applicants who have acquired previous education in English or are native English speakers are exempted from taking Proficiency tests in English.
- ▶ Applicant is also exempted from Proficiency tests in English if he/she has completed secondary education in a European Union, European Economic Area country or the Swiss Confederation and his/her secondary education

certificate includes English proficiency assessment that equals to B2 (or higher) level of the Common European Framework of Reference.

State Centralized Examination results of the Secondary General Education from candidates from Latvia;

Academic and scientific achievements, active participation in youth organisations, and other relevant activities are highly desirable.

For Early Application you need to:

- ▶ **Submit your full application by 12 April 2022;**
- ▶ **Submit your grade transcript for the previous semester with the average grade not lower than 7,5;**
- ▶ **Have English Proficiency (A&B level (7.5-10) in previous semester grade transcript, or IELTS 6.0+)**
- ▶ **Submit a motivation letter.**



Tuition fee waivers

To celebrate academic excellence and foster competition among students, RGSL has established the RGSL Student Excellence award for 2nd and 3rd year bachelor students with the highest grades in the previous study year.

RGSL offers tuition fee waivers for RGSL employees, their children, orphans and persons with 1st or 2nd degree of disability.

Early Application discount

All eligible applicants, local and foreign, who apply for studies by the Early Application deadline 12 April 2022 and fulfills the Early Application requirements receive a 10% tuition fee waiver for the first academic year.

Latvian state scholarships



Law Library

Research at RGSL is supported by the RGSL Law Library which is a popular place for students, faculty and visitors alike. Located on the top floor of the university, with stunning views across *Art Nouveau* Riga, it offers the top collection of legal literature in the Baltics and Northern Europe.

The library is open to students from RGSL and other universities, teaching staff, and the public. In addition to students, an increasing number of professionals make extensive use of the library, with its impressive collection of law books, legal journals, plus access to valuable legal and multidisciplinary databases such as Westlaw, HeinOnline, and resources from the Kluwer Law and Oxford University Press, and others.

Workspaces in the library are available for all students. It has a modern study environment and a rooftop terrace, which is especially good for taking study breaks or simply some fresh air.



Academic platform, projects and research

Every year, RGSL hosts a wide range of events with distinguished guests from academia, government, legal practice, industry, regulatory authorities, NGOs and the judiciary, where the students are invited to participate and benefit from the high-level content for their research purposes and networking opportunities.

RGSL is a host of the annual Human Rights Conference, which seeks to consolidate the academic and professional aspects of challenges in application of the Convention for the Protection of Human Rights and Fundamental Freedoms in Latvia to raise awareness about current problems and their possible solutions. Since 2006 this conference has become an integral part of Latvia's civil and legal discussion framework.

Since 2019 RGSL annually publishes the internationally recognized "Baltic Yearbook of International Law".

Annual RGSL International Students' Research Paper Conference has become a great platform for law students to present their research and engage in academic discussions with peers.

The best students thesis are published in the "RGSL Research Papers" series documenting the broad range of innovative scholarly work undertaken at RGSL.

RGSL Summer School on International and European law under the scientific leadership of Judge of the European Court of Justice and RGSL Professor Ineta Ziemele has become a place where students and law professionals can get the latest insights on international case law.



Student life

The dynamic academic atmosphere at RGSL is bolstered by an equally exciting student life, as extracurricular and social activities provide balance to intensive studies. Guest lecturers provide fresh perspectives to traditional study work while Student Association activities offer opportunities to develop relationships outside the classroom.

RGSL provides full support in helping students find relevant internships and networking opportunities.

Moot courts

Moot courts are a co-curricular activity at many law schools, where students take part in simulated court or arbitration proceedings. This academic year, RGSL students take part in three international Moot court competitions – Philip C. Jessup International Law Moot Court Competition, Willem C. Vis International Commercial Arbitration Moot or Vis Moot and Levan Alexidze Moot Court in Georgia. "Participation in moot courts educates new aspects of personality and improves not only legal knowledge, but also various soft skills, as well as argumentation skills," says Vis Moot team member

Aleksandra Aleksejeva. RGSL teams also participate in various Latvian moot courts with great success, as well as there is a strong tradition of so called "underground moot court" at RGSL, organized by RGSL Student Association.

Debate society

In 2019 RGSL students created the school's first Debate Society. "Nowadays, it is said that one of the main skills employers value is critical thinking. Therefore, active debaters are welcome to join the RGSL Debate Society to learn, to evolve and to develop argumentation, public speaking and critical thinking skills," says RGSL student and Debate Society's founder Annija Grūbe.

RGSL Chat Chamber

In 2020 RGSL students launched the RGSL Chat Chamber podcast where they interview distinguished professors and law professionals on professional and career topics. A year and 17 episodes later, the podcast is available on RGSL YouTube channel, Spotify, Anchor, Breaker, Google Podcasts, Apple Podcasts, Pocket Casts and RadioPublic.

Location and campus

RGSL is located in the heart of Riga's famous *Art Nouveau* District, within walking distance of the city's UNESCO-listed historic centre. Academic facilities are of the highest standard, including fully-equipped auditoriums and a student lounge. Many RGSL facilities are shared with the Stockholm School of Economics in Riga, providing additional opportunities for networking and socializing.



Life in Riga

Combining the rich culture and history of a European capital city with a thriving community of international students and reasonable living expenses, Riga offers an ideal environment for studies, work and socialising. It is a home for more than 6000 international students who enjoy a quality education, a rich cultural life, great entertainment venues, very fast internet and outdoor adventures. RGSL is served by efficient public transportation while Riga itself offers easy connections to other European cities via bus or plane. As a medium-sized university, RGSL is able to assist its students in finding suitable housing in Riga.

During your stay in Riga, you can expect to spend approximately EUR 500 per month on living expenses. This includes rent but not tuition fees.

RGSL actively promotes the student and staff exchange with the aim of diversifying the student group and faculty cohort, to create an enriching learning environment with meaningful discussions of inter-disciplinary subjects in law, international relations, economics and business.

RGSL also welcomes incoming Erasmus students from partner universities to spend one or two semesters in Riga, as all courses are taught in English and are available to mobility students.
