

## **Comparative Contract and Commercial Law**

**About the course:** This course focuses on the analysis of commercial

transactions, mainly contracts, from an international and comparative law perspective. It is not based on the legal rules applicable to commercial contracts in one specific jurisdiction (domestic law). This is a course with a strong methodological component where students, in addition to having the chance to work with legal rules (mostly at a supranational level: EU, Int'l Conventions), will be given ample opportunities to learn about the legal problem-solving method at an international level. From this perspective, this course is intensively more practical than theoretical as students will have to read, analyze and discuss, first individually and later in the classroom, a number of problems and court cases representative of conflictive situations arising in the field of international commercial transactions.
