



ACTION IN CASE OF RADIATION EXPOSURE OR CONTAMINATION

1. STOP WORK IMMEDIATELY



- Stop work immediately if radioactive contamination or exposure is detected
- Avoid exposing yourself or others to additional risk



2. WARN OTHERS

- Warn people nearby about the potential hazard
- Inform your supervisor or responsible personnel



3. RESTRICT ACCESS

- Isolate the contaminated area
- Restrict access using barriers or warning signs
- Organise evacuation if necessary



IF RADIOACTIVE MATERIAL ENTERS THE MOUTH

- Rinse the mouth to reduce intake of radioactive substances
- Spit out the rinsing fluid afterwards
- Induce vomiting only if instructed by medical professionals



IF RADIOACTIVE MATERIAL CONTACTS THE SKIN

- Immediately wash affected areas with water and soap or suitable cleansing agents
- Avoid damaging the skin through excessive scrubbing



IF RADIOACTIVE POWDER IS PRESENT

- Use paper, cloth or other absorbent materials
- Carefully collect contaminated material to avoid further spread



IF RADIOACTIVE LIQUID IS PRESENT

- Use paper, cloth or other absorbent materials
- Carefully collect contaminated material to avoid further spread
- Securely package contaminated materials
- Store all collected radioactive waste in designated radionuclide storage facilities



INFORM ABOUT THE CONTAMINATION

- Inform the administration or staff
- Inform emergency services (112) if necessary

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
