



ACTION IN THE EVENT OF DISCOVERING AN UNKNOWN SUBSTANCE OR OBJECT

1. UNKNOWN SUBSTANCE OR OBJECT FOUND

It could be:

- An unidentified substance in any physical state (solid, powder, liquid or gas);
- An object containing such a substance, or from which material is leaking, spilling or evaporating;
- Objects containing radioactive, chemical or biological substances, explosives, or related dispersal devices;
- Suspicious mail (letters, parcels or packages);
- Damaged or partially opened packages with unknown contents;
- Radioactive items exceeding permitted radiation levels;
- Other circumstances indicating potential malicious use of hazardous materials



2. ORGANISE EVACUATION AND EVACUATE YOURSELF

- If possible, ensure people move away from the hazardous area
- If indoors, evacuate occupants to reduce exposure risk

3. DO NOT TOUCH OR INTERACT WITH THE OBJECT

- Do not touch, move or inspect the object or substance
- Avoid direct contact
- Maintain a safe distance



4. REPORT IMMEDIATELY

- Immediately notify building staff or responsible personnel
- Call 112 if the situation appears dangerous
- Provide your name, location, address and describe the object
- Give the exact location of the item
- Remain at a safe distance until emergency services arrive

5. FOLLOW SAFETY PRECAUTIONS

If an explosive device is suspected:



- Do not touch the object
- Avoid using electronic devices nearby if they may increase risk
- Evacuate surrounding people



If chemical or biological substances are suspected:

- Avoid contact or inhalation
- Isolate the area if possible
- Use protective equipment if available

6. FOLLOW OFFICIAL INSTRUCTIONS

- Follow instructions from emergency services carefully
- Stay calm and provide assistance only if safe to do so
- The priority is to minimise risk to yourself and others
